AutoCAD was originally developed and marketed by Silvaco Systems, Inc., of Menlo Park, California, as a commercial desktop application for Apple II, IBM PC and DOS-compatible microcomputers. The first version of AutoCAD ran on the Apple II at a resolution of 256x192 pixels with color graphics. Silvaco also released a version of AutoCAD for the IBM PC. In 1985, Silvaco was acquired by Autodesk, which was renamed to Autodesk. The development team released AutoCAD with the 1980s push to develop computers with graphical user interfaces, but they found that text, line, block, and area commands were a better fit with their clients' business needs. ObjectARX ObjectARX is an AutoCAD API for building native AutoCAD extensions. The library was originally designed by Vladimir Vlacinov, but most development now occurs in the project's mailing list, where anyone can contribute. ObjectARX is a superset of C++ classes, with the ability to call the AutoCAD API using the AutoCAD Engine and VBScript (Autodesk Exchange Apps). In this way, an ObjectARX extension can be built as a VBScript or Windows application. The language was created in the early 1990s. When the "Application Add-on" was introduced in AutoCAD 2000, VBScript was adopted as the language to extend the functionality of AutoCAD. The VBScript language has some similarities to JavaScript. VBA VBA is a macro language originally developed by Borland for Microsoft Office applications, including AutoCAD. VBA has been used in AutoCAD since the first release in 1993. Macro languages Macro languages are another group of extensions, used in AutoCAD as well as other products from Autodesk. They allow the user to run commands, scripts, macros, or other file functions (such as dialog box windows) through single user commands. These can be recorded as a macro and then called by other files with the same functionality. A prominent Florida police union called on an officer to be fired Saturday after he was caught on camera accidentally shooting a family dog with a Taser. Officers had gone to the front door of Japhet Fuller's mobile home in Lutz, Fla., on Friday night to serve him with a warrant and were in the process of handcuffing him when they heard the dog barking, WPBF reported. Police said an officer tased the dog and the dog was subsequently struck. Officers then handcuffed the dog's owner, who was still inside the home, and one of them accidentally discharged the Taser, which struck the dog a second time. The dog was taken to a veterinarian, where it was put down. Fuller, who is black, said he did not appreciate police showing up at his home unannounced. "They didn't have a warrant," Fuller told the station. "They weren't even looking for me." City Commissioner Alan Berger said in a statement that the incident was "a total breakdown of police procedure" and that he will have to meet with police and city officials to review the matter further. "The officer involved will be disciplined and may lose his job," he added. Police Chief Gary Eugene said the department would conduct an internal affairs investigation, and the officer would face "termination, suspension or some other discipline" as a result. City manager Joe Becker told WPBF that firing the officer "would be out of proportion to this incident." "The officer acted incorrectly, but did nothing intentionally or wantonly," Becker said, adding that he will be reassessing the department's policies in light of the incident. Police did not respond to a request for comment from The Hill. The National Association of Police Organizations (NAPO) released a statement calling for the officer to be fired for the shooting, saying in a statement that "there is no excuse for the officer's decision to use a Taser." "The NAPO is appalled and saddened by the officer's handling of the situation. The officer's conduct is unacceptable and he should be held accountable for his actions," the statement said. "NAPO's primary concern, as always, is officer safety. Despite the unfortunate incident, the NAPO stands in support of law enforcement and its public safety mission."
